Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics Seminar Support

Idaho NSF EPSCoR will competitively award support to enable distinguished, nationally recognized faculty members from universities located outside of Idaho to visit the University of Idaho, Boise State University, or Idaho State University to present seminars.

The following award conditions will apply:

- EPSCoR support must be matched at least 1:2 with non-federal funding (\$1 non-federal support: \$2 EPSCoR funding).
- EPSCoR support will not exceed \$800 per seminar speaker.
- Seminar topics must be within STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics) fields and related to research areas eligible for support from the National Science Foundation (NSF).
- Preference will be given to speakers who address topics related to the current NSF EPSCoR RII research theme.

- A brief post-seminar report must be submitted to Idaho EPSCoR.
- Support must be acknowledged on seminar flyers and other promotional materials using a statement similar to: "Partial support for this seminar is provided by Idaho EPSCoR and the National Science Foundation under award number EPS-0447689."
- Seminars and associated travel must occur before May 3, 2008.

Faculty members who request support should succinctly describe: *who* is being invited, *what* distinguishes them in their field of research, *when* and *where* they will visit, and *why* bringing this speaker to Idaho is a wise investment. The requested level of financial support and match must also be specified. Requests may be submitted to Rick Schumaker at Idaho EPSCoR by mail, email, or fax.
