All students participating in a Study Abroad program are required to purchase adequate health/accident insurance for the entire period that they will be overseas. Please make sure you have read the Health & Insurance section of the Survival Guide for additional details about this form. We will assume you have read and understood the information. Your insurance **MUST** provide:

- Coverage overseas
- Sickness and accident coverage on a 24-hour basis
- Repatriation of Remains coverage of at least \$50,000
- Emergency Medical Evacuation coverage of at least \$100,000
- Lifetime max. benefit for accident or illness of at least \$500,000

IMPORTANT INFORMATION (Please read completely and carefully):**Study Abroad Program Insurances:**

Many study abroad programs offer or require that you buy insurance through their program. Some of these program insurances meet the study abroad requirements and some of them do not. Either way, you should keep in mind that many study abroad insurance programs will only cover you while you are abroad. So if something happens and you have to return home during your study abroad term(s), many program insurances will no longer cover you. Also, many study abroad program insurances require that you pay all medical, emergency evacuation, or repatriation charges up front then submit a claim to them to be reimbursed. Therefore, it is our recommendation that you keep or buy insurance that covers you in the U.S. and that will pay for medical and emergency expenses up front.

Study Abroad program insurances that meet UI Study Abroad requirements: AustraLearn, IFSA-Butler, ISA, or USAC.

If you are attending one of these programs, they do meet the UI Study Abroad requirements but you should keep the information above in mind. Please circle the program name below indicating that you understand that you will receive insurance with your program that meets the UI Study Abroad requirements. We do not need study abroad program insurance policy information. However, if you have other insurance, you should list that insurance address and policy information in the space listed below.

Study Abroad program insurances that DO NOT meet UI Study Abroad requirements: AEC, CIEE, ISEP, KCP

Although these programs do provide insurance or require you to buy insurance as a part of their program, the insurance provided through them **does not** meet the above stipulations. However, they may be used to supplement other insurance you may have in order to meet the UI requirements. If you are attending one of these programs, please circle the program name below indicating that you understand that you will receive insurance with your program but that it does not meet the UI Study Abroad requirements. Enter other insurance details you have to meet the UI Study Abroad requirements.

Students who have become degree-Seeking at the UI (usually for financial aid purposes) in order to study abroad:

You will automatically be charged for (~\$700/semester) and covered by the UI Student Health Insurance (SHIP). SHIP **does** meet the UI Study Abroad requirements and will cover you in the U.S. if you have to return during your study abroad term(s). If you have other insurance that meets the UI Study Abroad insurance requirements, you can waive SHIP. However, if you decide to waive SHIP, you must do this before the deadline which is **10 days after the start of each University of Idaho term.** You must waive SHIP by logging into your VandalWeb account: or downloading a

printable form at: <http://www.health.uidaho.edu/default.aspx?pid=56219>. If you keep SHIP, please enter only "SHIP" below. We do not need SHIP details. If you waive SHIP and will not receive program insurance that meets the UI Study Abroad requirements, enter the insurance details below for your insurance that does meet the UI Study Abroad requirements.

Non-UI students who are studying abroad through the UI as non-degree-seeking students are not eligible for SHIP (except for Non-U.S. Citizens/Residents – see below.)

SHIP **does** meet the UI Study Abroad requirements and will cover you in the U.S. if you have to return during your study abroad term(s).
